CENTER FOR DOMESTIC PEACE is a non-profit organization in existence now for 40 years working at the county, state, and national level to end domestic violence. Center for Domestic Peace (C4DP) serves women, men, and youth who have been, and/or are at risk of being abused and/or battered, who have perpetrated, and/or who are at risk of perpetrating, abuse, bullying, and/or battering. C4DP's programs helping children, teens, women, and men to live violence-free lives include: 24-hour hotlines; emergency shelters; transitional housing; support groups; legal advocacy; school programs; community prevention and education projects; professional continuing education programs; corporate, state, and nation-wide trainings; leadership development programs; and resource identification.

PRIMARY JOB RESPONSIBILITIES

C4DP is building a team of mental health practitioners, monolingual English and bilingual Spanish/English to provide group therapy for children and youth who have witnessed domestic violence, and their victim-parent as part of IN THIS TOGETHER, the agency's new family and group therapy program. The mental health team will conduct weekly family and group therapy sessions to address the mental health needs of survivor parents and their children ages 0-18, with a focus on healing and trauma recovery. These positions will be supervised by the Children and Youth Division Manager.

1. Provide family and group therapy for child and youth witnesses of domestic violence, age 0-18, and for their victim parents, on-site or in the community, who are a culturally and economically diverse.
2. Perform accurate and timely record-keeping and documentation.
3. Participate in group supervision and clinical trainings as requested.
4. Maintain confidentiality and exercise professional judgment at all times in keeping with the responsibility carried personally and by the agency for the care and welfare of youth and families.
5. Maintain and exercise cultural awareness and sensitivity to diversity.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Licensed MFT/LCSW/clinical psychologist/or professional clinical counselor currently registered with the California Board of Behavior Sciences.
2. Master's degree from an accredited institution in social work, psychiatric nursing, psychology, counseling or a closely related field, OR possession of a Doctoral degree in clinical psychology or a closely related field.
3. Two years of clinical mental health experience under qualified supervision in a mental health setting.
4. Two years of experience providing trauma informed therapy for children and youth 0-18 as well as their parents who have complex problems as the result of witnessing and experiencing domestic violence, dating violence or sexual assault.
5. Excellent written and oral communication skills.
6. Familiar with mental health resources in Marin County.
7. Excellent computer and documentation skills.
8. Excellent work habits, adherence to program protocols and maintenance of professional boundaries.
9. In-depth knowledge of, and alignment with, the battered women's justice movement perspective on batterers, abused and at-risk women, youth, and children, and progressive movements to end violence against women.

10. Demonstrated cultural awareness skills with the ability to build a common agenda.
11. Facilitating group sessions includes working until 7 PM once or twice a week.
12. Criminal justice clearance and fingerprinting as required by the organization.
13. Valid California driver's license, auto insurance, and vehicle required.
