Sonoma County Paratransit provides seniors and people with disabilities transportation from their homes to important appointments and errands across Sonoma County, enabling them to live more independently. More than 30,000 rides are provided each year, serving over 3,300 people in our community.

CVNL proudly operates Sonoma County Paratransit, where we are dedicated to serving our community with a caring, customer-focused team of both paid and volunteer drivers and customer service representatives. Our program is made possible through a service contract with Sonoma County Transit and generous contributions from the community.

Sonoma County Paratransit provides rides seven days a week for medical appointments, senior centers, shopping, visits to loved ones, or any location within our service area. Rides are provided between the County's incorporated cities, as well as within the cities of Rohnert Park, Cotati, Sebastopol, and Windsor. Rides are also provided in Sonoma Valley, Guerneville and the Monte Rio area.
